#### **Semester One Reports**

Student reports were sent home with children on Wednesday. The reports give detailed feedback to parents about students' levels of application and achievement throughout Terms 1 and 2. Whilst progress in All Key Learning Areas is important, I believe that social development, commitment to learning and work habits are the keys to success for all students. It is these skills and attitudes which support students to achieve their best and be successful at school every day. We ask parents to discuss the reports with their children, focusing on the positives and setting some goals for Semester 2.

#### Attendance

Student attendance is regularly monitored by the school and the Department's Home School Liaison Officers. A review of attendance over this semester has raised concerns with some of our children. These will be clear to parents as they are noted on student reports. Whilst a day here and there may not seem important at the time, the impact of these absences on a student's learning over a term or semester becomes quite significant. I have included some important reminders about the legal requirements regarding school attendance in this newsletter. Please read these carefully to ensure you are complying with the attendance policy.

#### **School Development Day**

Staff will be involved in a full day of professional learning for the School Development Day on Tuesday 23rd July. Additional hours will be completed on this day, as well as after school on Wednesday 1st August, to replace School Development Day 5 in Term 4 (21st December).

#### P&C Meeting

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 31st July from 3.15-4.15pm in the library. Please consider coming along to the meeting so that you are well-informed of school activities.

#### **Uniforms and Classroom Equipment**

Thank you to families who support our uniform policy and ensure their children wear the correct uniform each day. In addition to looking fantastic in our uniform, it provides students with a sense of belonging and promotes equity. I encourage families to take advantage of the holiday period to do a 'stocktake' at home. Please check:

- that all uniform items are on hand and in good condition ready for Term 3; and
- your child's classroom supplies these often need replenishing mid-year.

# Attendance

Missing school means your child misses out on vital information and maintaining learning routines. This can result in a loss of confidence and missing out on forming vital friendships.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- is sick, or has an infectious illness.
- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made outside school hours)
- Is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, an explanation must be provided within 7 days. Explanations other than those above are recorded as unjustified absences.

Students arriving late or leaving early, must be signed in/out at the Admin office. These are recorded as partial absences and, if regular, can have a serious impact on a child's learning. It is also important to note that explanations such as 'late' or 'slept in' are recorded as unjustified absences.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to talk to the school principal or the school counsellor.







# CAMDEN HAVEN HIGH SCHOOL End of Term 2 Report

There was so much happening at Camden Haven High School in term 2, so we have compiled a few of our favourite stories...

We were lucky enough to be visited by the Little Ripper Aviation Academy to show our Year 9/10 STEM class their drones. The students had a hands-on experience learning about the Westpac Little Ripper Lifesaver and how it can spot sharks and deliver rescue pods.







Our Year 12 Marine Studies students travelled to Lady Elliot Island for a handson experience in Coral Watch and Marine Debris, submitting their findings to scientists identifying trends in coral health. Most of the excursion was spent underwater, exploring the pristine coral reef and admiring the huge variety of wildlife.

We held the Distance Education minischool in Week 5, hosting 15 students for three action-packed days of fun and learning. Students were able to meet their teachers and connect with other isolated students, strengthening the network that will help them progress through their education and beyond.







Students and staff participated in National Reconciliation Week in a variety of ways; including art, community events and exploring the land and culture. During our DE minischool, students performed a traditional song and dance and there were activities focused on Aboriginal culture.
