In 2019, our students will complete the NAPLAN assessments online rather than a written format. To assist our staff prepare for this new format of testing, Year 3 and 5 students will participate in a 'Readiness Test' during Week 6 of this term. No results will be provided as a result of this testing but it will be a great opportunity for us to become more familiar with the online assessments prior to next year's testing.

The Importance of Resilience

The number of children who experience difficulty with their social and emotional skills and display a lack of resilience is an increasing concern. In schools we see firsthand the impact on children's learning, mental health and wellbeing when they lack the skills to adapt to change, take on new challenges or cope with disappointment when things don't always go as expected.

Children need to build resilience skills to be able to both enjoy good times and deal with hard times. These skills come more easily to some children than others. Helping children learn how to manage life's ups and downs and build their coping skills supports their mental health and wellbeing now and into the future.

Throughout this term I will be sharing information and strategies related to these issues in the newsletter. I hope parents and carers take the time to consider how they can support the development of these important life skills in their children.


